Kevin Howard was present to ask the council about the planned drainage study for the Lindsay Dr. area. Mayor Weekes states that Banner Associates has not completed the drainage study at this time. Craig Ulrich asks the council table for names, positions, and term dates. He asks questions on who is responsible to ensure the developers are following the ordinances and resolutions. He mentions the “Subdivision Regulations” Ordinance 304 and does not feel that it was enforced on when Lindsay Dr. when it was developed. Mayor Weekes states that the City Council and himself are in charge of enforcing ordinances and resolutions and he needs to look at when the ordinance was passed and when Spilde addition was constructed to help answer those questions. Mr. Ulrich also mentions getting grants for storm water that he had seen online and questions why detention ponds were not put in earlier.

Pat Tingle was present with the Aurora Event Committee and says that this years Gala Days went well and they are already making plans for next year.

Mike Ahartz – Fire Chief, reports 2 fire calls and 4 EMS calls this past month. Brush 1 needs repairs. Fire Dept. County Feed will be held this Thursday.

Joe Mersch – Maintenance Report – gutter on Broadway in front of the Quick Stop will be getting repaired and a few sewer service lines will be repaired as well.
